# **Stall Decoration Guidelines**

# **General Theme**

# **Structural Setup**

# 1. Stall Coverings:

- Use canvas drop cloths or old bedsheets dyed in earthy tones.
- o Repurpose burlap sacks or coffee bean bags for a rustic touch.

#### 2. Framework:

- Use wooden poles, pallets, or repurposed fencing to create the structure.
- o Hide any modern metal frames with cloth or wood panels.

#### **Decorative Elements**

#### 1. Banners and Flags:

- Cut old fabric into pennant shapes and paint medieval symbols using craft paint.

- o Borrow boots or simple sandals for footwear.

- Visit thrift stores, farms, or second-hand shops for affordable materials.
- Foraged greenery or repurposed items like wine barrels or old furniture add authenticity.
